Please read this document to familiarize yourself with the NHD State Contest venue.

Dane Smith Hall (building #48) is located on UNM's main campus north of the Duck Pond.

Registration

- Registration is located on the first floor, there are approximately 20 steps down to the lobby. A ramp is also available south of the stairs.
- Space is limited in this area, do not bring exhibits or props downstairs.
- Registration will be open from 8-10:30 a.m.

- NO parking (except handicapped) is available in front of or near Dane Smith Hall.
- A drop-off zone is in front of the building (which faces east), this is also UNM shuttle bus stop next to the duck pond.
 - Parking will be permitted in the C lot at the corner of Redondo and Las Lomas, as well as any A, B or C lot on campus.
- Handicapped parking is on the north side of the building, on Las Lomas, and also in the C lot at Las Lomas and Redondo. Parking is legal with any valid handicapped tag.
- Busses can drop off students in the drop-off zone, then must go park on Redondo Drive next to Johnson Field.

Contest:

- All contests will be held in Dane Smith (building #48)
 - First floor: Documentaries and Papers
 - Second floor: Exhibits, Performances and Websites
 - Third floor: Judges only
- 2:15 pm Noel Pugach will be presenting a performance as Harry S. Truman. *Compared to the "Great Roosevelt," whom he succeeded as thirty-third President of the United States, Harry S. Truman had undistinguished beginnings. Yet, by virtue of his direct style, earthy personality and willingness to make tough decisions, Truman left an indelible mark on the United States and the world. - Award Ceremony: Anthropology Lecture Hall (ANTH 163 in building # 11) next to Maxwell Museum approximately at 3:15 pm. A short meeting for students who qualified for Nationals will be held immediately after awards.

Transporting Exhibits and Performance Props

- From the drop off zone there are two ramps which lead directly to the SECOND floor, take your items there once you arrive. A contest sign with entry numbers and titles will be posted on the doors. To place your exhibit in the correct spot, go downstairs to register, then return to set-up your exhibit. Performance props, there is plenty of space in the hallway to leave items, go downstairs to register, then return to begin assembling items.

- Please do not take items to registration, then transport them upstairs. You will need to provide dollies, wagons, or extra people to transport your items upstairs.
- Senior Division exhibits and performances are in the South Hall, 2nd floor.
- Junior Division exhibits and performances are in the North Hall, 2nd floor.
- Exhibit set up 7:45 – 8:45 am. Remind students they must set up their exhibits, parents may assist in lifting and holding. NOTHING else. Exhibit takedown 1:00-3:15 pm
- There is one elevator in the building and it is OFF LIMITS to students, parents and teachers (unless it is needed for mobility.) Exhibits and props are not permitted. The elevator is reserved for the judges.

Food

- The nearest restaurant is Golden Pride on Lomas Blvd. NE
- UNM Student Union building: only open venue is the UNM Mercado (it's a small store with a few refrigerated items), all other restaurants are closed.
- On Central, across from UNM, there are several restaurants: Wendy's, McDonald's, Saggio's, Frontier etcetera, which is approximately a 20-minute walk from Dane Smith Hall.
- Teachers and parents will be allocated a room on the third floor to store coolers or other food items for students, but students will not be permitted on the third floor.
- If you choose to have food delivered, make certain delivery person knows where Dane Smith Hall is located. There is a north entrance and a very small parking lot where they can deliver food. This is NOT a drop off zone for students.

Things to know

- The 3rd floor is reserved for judges only, no unauthorized access on this floor.
- Students may relax in the foyer, common areas, and outdoors.
- Students must remain quiet in the hallways outside competition rooms. Noisy students will be asked to move. Students should keep their areas neat and tidy; trash should not be left about.
- Documentary rooms will be open from 7:45 - 8:45 a.m. to test documentaries.
- Downtime events to keep students occupied:
 - NHD State timeline: each group or individual project, should bring a sheet of paper (8½ x 5½, think half a sheet of copy paper, tall) with their topic and 5 facts about their topic, it can be typed or handwritten, which will be placed on the timeline.
 - Letter writing campaign for soldiers. Stationary and suggestions will be provided.
 - Students are encouraged to watch documentaries and performances. All the judging rooms are conveniently in the same building.
 - Phi Alpha Theta history honor students will be organizing activities for students when they are not in judging sessions.
